

- Our world today mainly relies on violence to solve its conflicts.
- Peacemaking is sometimes employed, in a haphazard manner, after the violence already started.
- We need to stop the violence before it erupts. We need to prevent it.
- We need to give easily available opportunities for the parties involved in conflict to resolve it peacefully.
- Conflict Resolution Centres (CRC) need to be established at local, regional, and world-wide levels, staffed with competent conflict resolution specialists.
- At the Centres, conflicting parties would have the opportunity to solve their conflicts by mediation, at the request of anyone involved in the conflict.
- If the parties in conflict do not approach an appropriate CRC before the conflict becomes known to others, and the conflict is liable to harm the parties themselves, or anyone else, the parties could be referred to a CRC by anyone who has knowledge of the conflict, as soon as the conflict is known.
- CRC staff would have the authority to mandate that the parties engage in the conflict resolution process.
